

**Meeting Minutes of the 2025 1st Meeting of Open Data Advisory Group,
Ministry of Finance**

II. Location: Fiscal Information Agency (hereinafter referred to as “FIA”) 102 Conference Room

III. Reporting Matters:

1.The Ministry of Digital Affairs (MODA) is conducting the 2025 “Government Open Data Awarding Event.” The implementation status of each department and institution under the Ministry of Finance (MOF) is submitted for acknowledgment and guidance.

Resolution:

Retained for future reference. As the current-year scoring has been adjusted to compute the average across three statistical periods, all MOF subordinate agencies and institutions shall coordinate with the FIA’s inspection schedule to conduct the required open dataset quality label inspections and apply the corresponding additions/deductions. This is to maintain MOF open data quality, enhance the effectiveness of public use, and strive for strong performance in the 2025 Government Open Data Awarding Event.

2.Proposal to enhance MOF platinum-label datasets, submitted for acknowledgment and guidance.

Resolution:

Retained for future reference. All MOF subordinate agencies and institutions shall continue improving their datasets in accordance with the current-year platinum-label requirements, and the FIA shall conduct the relevant checks and verifications per the specified timeline.

3.MODA has introduced a new “Exemplary Open Text Corpus Award” this year. Matters for cooperation by MOF subordinate agencies and institutions are submitted for acknowledgment and guidance.

Resolution:

Retained for future reference. To support MODA’s initiative to build a Taiwan sovereign AI training corpus and systematically collect high-quality Traditional Chinese corpora, once MODA issues the detailed evaluation/ scoring criteria for the Exemplary Open Text Corpus Award, the FIA shall circulate the information and

request MOF agencies to comply. When providing text corpora, agencies shall carefully consider the issues raised by members regarding copyright and de-identification, so as to avoid disputes and personal-data leakage risks.
