

2024 Administrative Performance Report of the Ministry of Finance

1. Strengthening fiscal management to enhance fiscal resilience

- (1) Cultivating financial capacity to support government administration.
- (2) Strengthening treasury management to fulfill a high-quality treasury service network.
- (3) Optimizing treasury payment services to enhance the efficacy of electronic payments.
- (4) Strengthening debt management to enhance fiscal soundness for local governments.
- (5) Promoting regular, moderate issuance of government bonds and treasury bills, and improving the efficacy of debt management.
- (6) Improving local fiscal autonomy and strengthening assistance in local government finance.
- (7) Enhancing the management of the Public Welfare Lottery to increase social welfare revenues.
- (8) Advancing the management of government-owned shares to enhance operational synergies.
- (9) Strengthening the management of revenues from charges and fees, fines, indemnities, and other revenues of various agencies to fully implement the charges and fees collection system.
- (10) Improving tobacco and alcohol administration to protect public consumer safety.

2. Building up a high-quality tax environment to implement fair and reasonable taxation as well as simplified administration

- (1) Promoting reasonable taxation and optimizing our tax environment.
- (2) Strengthening tax collection to maintain fairness.
- (3) Implementing measures to improve tax services and simplify administration.
- (4) Promoting the signing of income tax agreements.
- (5) Implementing international standards on tax information transparency and strengthening cross-border tax certainty.
- (6) Strengthening substantial international participation.
- (7) Promoting the signing of fiscal cooperation agreements.
- (8) Extending tax reduction measures for key raw materials to stabilize domestic prices.

3. Optimizing customs technology inspection and ensuring secure and facilitated customs clearance services

- (1) Undertaking rationalization of customs regulations to strengthen clearance facilitation and security.

- (2) Enhancing coordination among border agencies and expediting customs clearance of goods.
- (3) Implementing alignment of tariff classification with international standards and fulfilling commitments to tariff reductions.
- (4) Implementing anti-dumping measures to maintain the fair trade environment.
- (5) Optimizing technology-based inspection equipment to strengthen the effectiveness of border enforcement.
- (6) Utilizing IoT real-time monitoring to ensure the secure movement of goods.
- (7) Advancing AI Selection System and enhancing capability and efficiency of Post-Clearance Audit.
- (8) Digitalizing management of bonded areas and enhancing facilitated customs clearance services.
- (9) Promoting the digital transformation of Customs services and enhancing the government's cloud adoption.
- (10) Deepening bilateral and multilateral customs cooperation, and promoting cross-border trade security and facilitation.

4. Facilitating the management of national assets and improving the utilization efficiency of revitalization

- (1) Revitalizing national public-use property.
- (2) Diversifying the use of national non-public-use real estate.
- (3) Executing “Plan for Strengthening Clean-Up of Occupied National Non-Public-Use Real Estate — Phase 2.”
- (4) Revitalizing national assets in coordination with the promotion of national green energy policies.
- (5) Assisting government agencies at all levels in appropriating national real estate for official or public infrastructure projects to facilitate national development.
- (6) Promoting property e-management.
- (7) Actively managing national real estate to facilitate the utilization of non-public use properties.
- (8) Clarifying and organizing changes in the national property database.
- (9) Entrusting National Land Surveying and Mapping Center, Ministry of the Interior, to take aerial photography in order to make good use of national properties.
- (10) Revitalizing military bases through transformation into national non-public-use property.
- (11) Promoting the greenification and beautification of national non-public use land and the adoption of real estate to improve management efficiency.

- (12) Executing “Salute to the Sea: Coastal Cleaning and Maintenance Program.”
- (13) Promoting organic agriculture and facilitating agriculture-friendly environments and the sustainable use of resources.
- (14) Executing “Project for the Restoration, Management, and Conservation of National Non-Public Use Cultural Heritage Sites.”
- (15) Assisting in promoting areca nut control, taking into account soil and water conservation and the income of farmers.
- (16) Processing applications for deferred collection and refund of rent for the expansion of lands reserved for indigenous people, thereby realizing the restoration of rights.

5. Leading priority infrastructure projects to adopt PPIP Act and refine PPP dispute mediation mechanism

- (1) Achieving annual objectives of private investment in infrastructure.
- (2) Optimizing legislation and making policies to guide private investment in priority infrastructure projects.
- (3) Continuing to provide pre-operation projects with counseling, marketing, and subsidies to encourage private investment in infrastructure.
- (4) Upgrading supervision and performance evaluation and refining PPP dispute mediation mechanisms.

6. Making use of emerging information and communication technologies, and creating value-added benefits from fiscal data

- (1) Enhancing the capacity to serve the public, stabilizing the core tax system, and establishing a sustainable, energy-saving, and secure environment.
- (2) Promoting cloud invoice and providing intelligent and various channels for customer service.
- (3) Enhancing the technology of tax data analytics and optimizing support for policy formulation.
- (4) Expanding the range of local tax services to enhance the convenience of tax inquiries and payment services.
- (5) Continuing to promote multiple tax payment channels and providing convenient tax payment services.
- (6) Expanding the resource pool of the Unified Data Center of the Ministry of Finance to enhance the robustness and security of the infrastructure platform.
- (7) Optimizing the cross-agency data transmission mechanism to ensure the security of data transmission.
- (8) Establishing cloud backup and core functional emergency response mechanisms, and improving operational procedures and implementing digital empowerment.
